# **ASSEMBLY**



Recharge only with the charger specified for the battery. For specific charging instructions, read the operator's manual supplied with your charger and battery.

#### Inserting/Removing Battery Pack

Insert the battery pack by sliding battery pack into the body of the tool. Insert the battery pack until the battery latches lock.

To **remove** the battery pack, press in both battery latches and slide the battery pack off of the tool.



To reduce the risk of injury, do not look directly into the light when the light is on.

Pull the trigger to turn the light on or off. Pull the trigger halfway for momentary light. Pull the trigger fully and release to lock in the "On" position. To turn off, pull the trigger fully and release.

Use the mode button to select the brightness. The last selected mode will default when the trigger is pulled. Press and hold the mode button to start or stop the strobe mode.
